ORDINANCE NO. 2014-22

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2014-2015 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE PURPOSES, REDUCTION IN RENT, AND RETIREMENT FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central did not include additional funds within the 2014-15 Fiscal Year General Budget for an increase in general liability insurance related to the employment of a full-time assistant to the Chief of Police for the City of Central Police Department;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central recognizes that the City of Central Police Department has moved to Suite 6 and rent for Suite 7 will no longer be required;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central recognizes that the City of Central Police Department will not be required by the Municipal Police Retirement System to provide retirement for the Chief of Police;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central desires to amend the 2014-2015 Fiscal Year General Budget to appropriate funds necessary related to the above stated matters.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Central, State of Louisiana as follows:

Section 1. Account No. 000.421.05.520 is hereby increased by \$1,398.08 to provide for the increase in General Liability Insurance resulting from employing an Assistant Chief in the City of Central Police Department.

Section 2. Account No. 000.421.05.441 is hereby decreased by \$2,200.00 for the rent related to Suite 7 which the City of Central Police Department no longer occupies.

Section 3. Account No. 000.421.05.230 is hereby decreased by \$8,347.50 for retirement that is not required by the Municipal Police Retirement System under current conditions for the Chief of Police for the City of Central.

Section 4. Conflicts

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Severability

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or parts thereof, other than the part declared invalid. The remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the declaration of invalidity and shall remain in force and effect.

Section 6. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.




